a. Komm, süßer Tod (A, 2000)



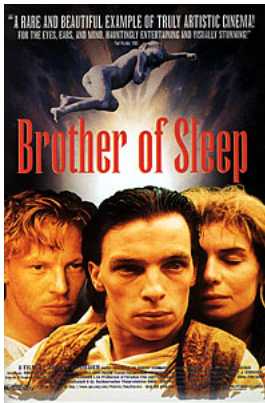
Eine gelungene Adaption des Erfolgskrimis von Wolf Haas. Hader spielt den gemütlichen Expolizisten und Neu-Rettungsfahrer Brenner, der kettenrauchend und völlig ambitionslos durch das Leben surft. Als eine Reihe mysteriöser Morde sein direktes berufliches Umfeld erschüttert, kommt selbst Brenner leicht ins Wanken. Sein Kollege Piefke (Bernd Michael Lade) liegt tot im Rettungswagen. Schon seit längerem tobt ein gnadenloser Wettbewerb zwischen konkurrierenden Wiener Rettungsdiensten. Brenner riecht Lunte. Widerwillig beginnt er, hinter den Kulissen herumzuschnüffeln. Zu allem Überfluss taucht auch noch seine alte Jugendliebe Klara wieder auf.

b. Im Juli (D, 2000, Subtitles)



Daniel is a young teacher in-spe, who in contrast to everyone else plans to stay in Hamburg for the summer. Juli, a girl at the flea-market, wants to get known to Daniel and manages to sell him a Mayan ring with a sun on it, foretelling him that he will meet a girl with a sun. One day later Daniel is already on his way across Europe. It seems the prophecy came true somehow.

c. Schlafes' Bruder (D, 1996, Subtitles)



BROTHER OF SLEEP is based on Robert Schneider's bestseller of the same name and one of the most popular European novels of the decade. BROTHER OF SLEEP is an epic story off passion, music and spirituality. Academy award winning production designer for Cabaret and Das Boot, Rob Zehetbauer, has outdone himself by recreating an entire village in the Bavarian Alps. BROTHER OF SLEEP recounts the story of musician Johannes Elias Alder, a man with supernatural hearing and prodigious musical ability. Born the illegitimate son of the local priest, and derided as a "child of the Devil," he must somehow learn to deal with his extraordinary talents. Set in a remote village among the Alpine peaks, Alder's fate is sealed by the dichotomy of his tormented genius and his love for a woman he cannot have.

How to find us:

From Route 128, take the Westwood/Route 109 exit. Follow Route 109 South for about 8 miles until Brook Street in Medfield. Turn right on Brook and right again on Green Street. 109 is ½ mile up the street on your left (a yellow house with columns on the front porch). (15 min)

Route 27 also takes you to Medfield from Natick/Sherborn or Routes 1 and 95 in Walpole (see map).
