Austria, 1952 – German, no subtitles!



A "Dienstmann", introduced in Austria/Hungary in 1859, had to be licensed by the state, and wore a uniform, with license number on the hat. Besides that, he was available to calls in public places for short-time work of luggage transportation, messenger, but also household chores etc.

In this movie, set in post-war Vienna, we have two of those, a real (Hans Moser in his classic role) and a fake one (Paul Hörbiger, who is really a professor of operetta at fictitious Strauss Academy).

As comedies go, there are a lot of twists going on. Alcoholic beverages were consumed aplenty, from early in the morning to late at night. All in all, this is a very charming and enjoyable musical comedy.

How to find us:

From Route 128, take exit 16B (Westwood/Route 109). Follow Route 109 South for about 8 miles until Brook Street in Medfield. Turn right onto Brook and right again at the end onto Green Street. #92 is 1/2 mile up the street on your left (a yellow house with columns on the front porch). (25 min)

Route 27 also takes you to Medfield from Natick/Sherborn or Routes 1 and 95 in Walpole (see map).
