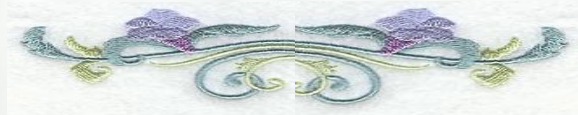
The rich history of the Austro-American Association of Boston dates back to its founding in 1944 by a group of Austrians living in the Boston area, who had settled there shortly before World War II.
